Council stated they will give the idea some thought and tabled the subject until next month.

MAINTENACE: N. Arthur stated that the Christmas lights during the holiday season, kept tripping the breaker at the fire station which was connected to the fire department's freezer. Newberg made motion to have an outside outlet installed at the fire station to prevent this from occurring, seconded by Arment, all ayes, motion carried.
